Featured Rotarian: Yvette Weeks

Yvette Weeks enlightened us on the history of Daylight Savings Time. April 30, 1916, at 11pm, Daylight Savings Time was first introduced in Germany and Austria during WW1 as a fuel and energy savings initiative. Many other countries followed shortly after. The US's first experience with Daylight Savings time started in 1918. Then, during WW2 wartime President Roosevelt instituted year around daylight savings time from 2/9/42 to 9/30/45. The US had no standard time until 1966, when the Standard Time Uniform Time Act set official time-zones in the United States. On 1/6/1974 Nixon enacted the Emergency Daylight Savings Time Act which standardized time throughout the US for the first time.

Our current Daylight Savings laws were enacted in 2006. It defines that on the Sunday after Halloween clocks fall back from 2am to 1am. Since the latest adjustments to the laws coming into effect in 2007, Child pedestrian deaths have fallen 27%. Oregon and Washington have both passed legislation to observe daylight savings time year around, but California has not been able to do it and this prevents the change for us. The next "spring forward" to Daylight Savings Time will be on 3/8/2020, when 2am becomes 3am.

Every Woman's Treaty is a movement started by a group of committed people to create the opportunity for a life free of all forms of violence for every woman and girl world-wide. According to the United Nations, 35% all women experience physical and or sexual violence in their lifetime.

Violence against women is defined at a high level as, women shouldn't be raped, beaten, abused, killed. Economically speaking: Reacting to violence against women, as opposed to prevention, drains 5.5% of the global economy. This cost far exceeds costs of implementing proven prevention programs. In nations that enact domestic violence laws, mortality rates for women are immediately reduced by 32% after laws are implemented.

The EWT is a group of women's activists who are experts of women's rights in their own countries and fields. In all, 1,700 activists globally. Team Mission is to stop Rape, Beating, Killing. Their mission framework is to: 1) Change Laws 2) Training and Accountability 3) Prevention / Education 4) Services for Survivors 5) Funding

The team is working together with 30 law schools to have evidence-based research collected and organized to inform countries when those countries are ready to come together to draft the treaty
