Featured Speaker Stephen Griffith



Our club member, Steve Griffith, joined the club in 2008, spoke to our club about his one year experience living in Bhutan, while teaching English and Law.

Steve is an amazingly accomplished man, with degrees from Harvard, Stanford, Oxford, and other ivy league schools. He speaks 7 languages, and lived all over the world

Living and teaching in Bhutan is Steve's latest adventure. While there, he hiked at 5000-15000ft elevations, ran a marathon, met the prime minister, and established many friendships.

Bhutan is a rugged, mountainous country with very few flat land. It borders populous China and India, but it has a small population of ¾ million. The only airport is in Thimphu, the capital. The official language is Bhutanese, and English is the second language, while the main religion is Buddhist.
