However, **"It Takes a Village"** (of club and community members) to excel in supporting and sustaining these students that promotes "building good-will and better friendships" and "peace on earth."

"It Takes a Village" is the first of its kind international community celebration and fund-raiser held on **Tues, Sept 11 from 3:00 pm to 7:00 pm** in Rhinegarten Park.
