## PRESIDENT ROB'S PERSPECTIVE

**On the Rotary Calendar, January is Vocational Service Month.** So what does this recognition mean for us? To answer this question, I suggest we re-examine the philosophical statement of Rotary International's purpose, which states:

*The object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster: 1) The development of acquaintance as a opportunity for service; 2) High ethical standards in business and professions; the recognition of worthiness of all useful occupations; and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society; 3) The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life; and 4) The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.*

**The concept of Vocational Service** (the second of our Five Avenues of Service) is rooted in the second object (mentioned above), which calls on us as Rotarians to "encourage and foster: 1) High ethical standards in our business and professions; 2) recognize the worthiness of all useful occupations, and 3) dignify each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society. So ask yourself (especially this month of January, Vocational Service Month), how can I put these ideals into action?

**There once was a non-written Rotary Club Rule**, when I joined Rotary in 2010 that if you talked about your business and employment, you fined (like having your cell phone ring during a club meeting). Therefore, we Rotarians did not talk about our professions, or vocations. **No more**; today, this attitude and action has changed 180 degrees. District Governors and Club Presidents are encouraged our fellow Rotarians to have conversations about our businesses, professions and vocations. Furthermore, we can enact our Vocational Service by taking time to learn about each other's occupations during our lunch meetings as well as encourage our Club's "yellow ribbon" Rotarians to be a guest speaker and give their "Vocational Talk." Notice, Maira Padilla, is signed-up and scheduled to give her talk on January 30, 2019.

**We also engage in Vocational Service when** we use our skills and expertise to serve our local and global community through a service project by helping young people achieve their career goals and/or being a mentor to a student. A way we engage in Rotary Vocational Service and bring our business and profession ethics to life is when we volunteer and / or financially support any of our Club, District, RI programs and projects. Through our actions, we promote peace (Club and District Rotary Youth Exchange Program); enable disease prevention and treatment (End Polio Now); support clean water and health sanitation; maternal and child health; basic education and literacy (Dictionary Project and Head Start Children's Book and Literacy Project); and provide economic and community development (White Salmon Community Pride and The Holiday Giving Tree). Furthermore, we can engage others in our occupational-professional-vocational networks to participate and / or support Rotarian programs and projects; especially when we invite others in share in the fun and fellowship as **a Rotarian, a person of action.**
