Born in the suburbs of Los Angeles, Jim Cornelius grew up dreaming of distant frontiers, of mountain men, long hunters, African explorers.


His older brother gave him a tattered copy of Allan W. Eckert's The Frontiersmen, a biography of Simon Kenton, and the twig was bent.

I had been reading a few authors on the concept of critical thinking. Not just for scientific process, but in personal use and in helping a team to see it's strengths. The books by a Minnesota-based professor, Stephen D. Brookfield, became a source of frequent morning reading.



We communicated frequently and, through our discussions, it helped me clarify this interpretation of leading a team. This is what I wrote down back in 2010 and I try constantly to apply this in actions:

"We have an opportunity to be transactional and possibly make direct impact at a set point in time. And we have an opportunity to be transformational and attempt to bring dreams of change into reality. Great leadership has an ability and hopefully the foresight to use transactions with fortitude, courage, humility and humanity to bring about the action of transformation."

Apply it to our recent service. Perhaps we have enhanced the celebration of the Fourth of July locally by helping with the replacement for the Runway Rumble. Based on some of the complimentary comments this weekend, perhaps our Quilt Passport Program has indeed enhanced the pre-show experience as the locals and others who gather for our world-renown quilt exhibition with interactions between our merchants and their increased clientele.
