President Sandy: Great News on Grants

Dear Fellow Rotarians,

An update on our grant requests for this upcoming year. Two of our three grant submissions have final approval.

This past week we received an email from the City of Sisters that our request for \$1,000 to support the "Books 4 Kids" program has been approved and funds will be distributed soon. This is a significant increase from previous year's grant support. We will make excellent use of it in bringing the program to next spring's first grade students in the new school. (Keep your Grinch costume ready, Mike Gray).



One of our Rotary District Grants also has final approval. Support for the Sleep in Heavenly Peace, "Build a Bed" program has received a \$2,000 grant and, as we have in the past, we increased this with a matching \$2,000 from our Foundation funds. There is no confirmed date, but it appears as though it will be in late October or early November at a location in Bend.

We are awaiting final signatures for our International Service District Grant request in conjunction with the Bend Rotary Club to support the project along with Ten Friends.

We hope to see the final approval by the end of this month.

I'm looking forward to listening the Audrey Tehan, from Seed to Table. She will update us on the changes at the farm and maybe provide some excitement from her latest trip down the Colorado River in the Grand Canyon.

Our club has budgeted funds to support a member going to these district sessions, so if you are interested in the Leadership Institute, and I hope some of you are, let me know and I will forward the details over to you. You could be seeing me there:

The Rotary Leadership Institute (RLI) planned for Ashland has opened for registration and spaces are filling up. Registration is limited, so securing a spot nowis wise.
