First, we will be working with **Sleep in Heavenly Peace again, scheduled for Saturday, November 9**. The exact location hasn't been set, but it will most likely be in Bend. We will be building beds alongside the Rotary Club of Bend.

Next, **World Polio Day is October 24**. The Bill Gates Foundation has pledged to match \$2 for every \$1 that Rotary donates up to \$50 million. Polio cases have increased this year in Afghanistan, Pakistan and now in Gaza during the war there.



The Rotary PolioPlus Society was founded in District 5110 in 2012-2013. Our club goal towards the PolioPlus foundation is \$2000. The fiscal year is early with only two months reported so far, but we are a little behind in reaching our goal.

Five Candidates Submit For Sisters Three Open Council Seats

Rotary International's political policy is to remain neutral on political issues while also educating members on local politics. Rotary's constitution prohibits clubs from taking sides on public issues, endorsing candidates, or lobbying.

There are three open seats for the City of Sisters City Council on the fall ballot and five candidates vying for those vacancies. They are Jennifer Letz, Eli Madrone, Sarah McDougall, Cheryl Pellerin and Josh Smith from our club. Again, Rotary does not endorse candidates, but acknowledges, appreciates and respects all who actively pursue public and community service.

GOALS FOR PRESIDENT SANDY'S YEAR TO KEEP IN FOCUS



The Club Goals program will be driven this year by the 18 goals for measurement within Rotary International's websiteat My Rotary under Rotary Club Central:

1) **Service Participation**, the number of club members participating on projects our goal for 2024/25 is **30 members**.

2) **Social Activities**, separate activities within your club's area, our goal for the year is **8** events/activities.

3) **Leadership Development participation**, I have submitted a goal of **4 individuals** for the year.

4) District Training participation, again I have submitted a goal of 4 individuals.

5) **Annual Fund contributions**, I have brought our goal up only slightly to **\$10,000**. We reached \$9895 of a \$7500 goal this past year.

6) **Polio Plus Contributions**, I have submitted a goal of **\$2000.** We missed last year with \$1908 of \$2500.

7) Club Membership, we have a goal of **44 members**, that means adding at least four new members while retaining all current members and hopefully not losing any.

8) Media Stories about Club projects, I have placed a goal of six mentions in public media.

9) A review and consideration to **update club bylaws**. this is a recommendation from RI.
