# **April 30 Program - County Courthouse Bond Measure**

The proposed courthouse would be built on the former Eugene City Hall lot and accommodate 18 state-run courtrooms, up from the current 15, as well as the district attorney so office, parole and probation, victim services and sheriff so office. At 297,000 square feet, the proposed building would be more than double the size of the current county courthouse at Seventh Avenue and Oak Street in

downtown Eugene.

The estimated cost of the project is \$252 million. The county is in line to receive \$87.6 million in state funding for the project, pending legislative approval. The county already has received \$6.4 million in state funding for planning work.

## **May 7 Program - EWEB Steam Plant Restoration**

The oldest standing structure on the Downtown Riverfront property, the Steam Plant has the potential to connect Eugene's future to its past. As part of the Downtown Riverfront redevelopment, the EWEB Riverfront Master Plan emphasizes the community's wish to reveal the �layers of history� embedded in the site to create this special, historically significant place. Its unique position as an icon of Eugene�s industrial past and location within 50 feet of the top of the riverbank calls for the plant to be preserved and repurposed as an important historical landmark at the east end of the Downtown Riverfront property.

As we gear up to become Graduate Eugene, the hotel will be undergoing many changes that I would like to make you fully aware of so that there are no surprises.

As of February 25<sup>th</sup> the hotel lobby will start the process to get its face lift, walls will be going up and things will be moving. Singular clinicians serve up to 5 different villages in remote areas, and act as the sole medical practitioner in the surrounding area. The sole mode of transportation on dilapidated roads between communities is motorcycles. We will be raising funds to provide another motorcycle for the Rural Health Team to assist with that transportation and allow the volunteers to widen their range of practice.



# Keynote Speaker Paul K. Chappell

Paul K. Chappell is an international peace educator and serves as the Peace Literacy Director of the Nuclear Age Peace Foundation. He graduated from West Point, was deployed to Iraq, and left active duty as a Captain. Realizing that humanity is facing new



challenges that require us to become as welltrained in waging peace as soldiers are in waging war, Chappell created Peace Literacy to help students and adults from all backgrounds work toward their full potential and a more peaceful world.

Peace Literacy frames peace not merely as a goal, but as a practical skill-set that allows us to increase realistic peace in our lives, communities, nations, and the world. Peace Literacy also helps us fully develop our human capacity for empathy, conscience, reason, and realistic hope.

Chappell is the author of the seven-book Road to Peace series about ending war, waging peace, the art of living, and our shared humanity. The first six published books in this series are Will War Ever End?, The End of War, Peaceful Revolution, The Art of Waging Peace, The Cosmic Ocean, and Soldiers of Peace.
