This Week's Speaker: Kellie Hill, 4-Way Test Speech Contest

Last Week's Speaker: Peter Buckley, Update on Trauma-Informed Practices in Southern Oregon

#### Summary of last week's topic:

Peter Buckley joined Southern Oregon Success in 2016 after his tenure in the Oregon Legislature. He described the ACES Study Adverse Childhood Experiences Study and the findings which have developed several programs to reduce childhood trauma. The Southern Oregon ACEs Training Team has presented over 400 sessions on ACEs and Resilience to over 14,000 participants since 2016. ACEs and Resilience information has developed a common language and common vocabulary for collaborative work across all sectors. Peter described that resilience is the science of why and the science of hope. Positive stress happens, for example, when we are struggling to learn something new. However, adverse childhood experiences are 'toxic stress'. Kids who grow up in toxic stress environments adapt behaviors such as fight, flight, or freeze.

The ACEs study included 17,000 people and found the higher level of adversity, the greater number of health problems and social problems. But what is predictable is preventable. Can we use tools of resilience to build support for children, families, and our community? Schools that adopt Trauma Informed practices are showing great success with closing the achievement gap and decreasing student discipline cases. The organization's goal is that by 2025, all parents and caregivers in Jackson and Josephine counties will have the knowledge and skills, connections and support needed for all their children to enter Kindergarten ready to thrive. ### **Dues Structure for 2021-22 Rotary Year**

The Board will be sending out member dues statement in the beginning of May. For renewing Rotarians, your net dues will be \$150. This figure includes a \$50 reduction from last years dues of \$300 to \$250 and a one-time rebate of \$100 from the Inn of the Commons meeting fee surplus. There are no meeting fees in the dues statement as the Board is unable to determine at this time what they may be or how they will be paid.

About 60% of your dues is goes for District and Rotary International dues, and the remaining 40% goes for club administration and our youth programs.

For new Rotarians joining our club, their dues will be \$250, except for new members under the age of 40 where their dues will be \$180 for two years.
