**Summary of last week's topic:** Butte Falls Community Forest

Bill Thorndike filled in for the Butte Falls, Mayor Laura Spencer for today's program. Bill gave a great presentation stating with a brief history of the small town. In 1906, the Sugar Pine Sawmill was built, and powered at the falls on the Big Butte Creek. It is Jackson County's smallest incorporated city with a 6-member council. It is the only city surrounded by timber around all sides. In 2019, Governor Kate Brown designated Butte Falls Community Forest a Solutions Project. The land is managed for private timber harvesting. The town has been working hard to purchase the property by the end of 2021. They have received a US Forest Service Matching Grant that must be matched with non-federal monies. What better way to manage forestland in your community than by community members themselves. When the project is completed, the Community Forest will increase wildlife resilience drinking water preservation and improve fish and wildlife habitat, expand recreation opportunities support education and research through charter schools and local colleges and boost the area's economy.

## Dues Structure for 2021-22 Rotary Year

The Board will be sending out member dues statement in the beginning of May. For renewing Rotarians, your net dues will be \$150. This figure includes a \$50 reduction from last years dues of \$300 to \$250 and a one-time rebate of \$100 from the Inn of the Commons meeting fee surplus. There are no meeting fees in the dues statement as the Board is unable to determine at this time what they may be or how they will be paid.

About 60% of your dues is goes for District and Rotary International dues, and the remaining 40% goes for club administration and our youth programs.

For new Rotarians joining our club, their dues will be \$250, except for new members under the age of 40 where their dues will be \$180 for two years.
