Weekly Program



Speaker: Geraldine Nicol

Topic: Langa Early Childhood Development Center, Newlands Rotary Club, South Africa

Langa has an estimated 4000 children of pre-school-going age, of which existing ECD centres in the area only provide for around half. Many of these existing community-based facilities are at best informal, and unregistered, ranging from single shacks or converted containers with open yards, to adapted RDP houses. Due to their informal nature, most are non-compliant with the municipal by-law and the South African National Building Standards and therefore unable to obtain accreditation from the Departments of Education or Social Development. Most of these facilities charge minimal fees, which are not paid regularly, and do not have any other source of income. Without accreditation, they are unable to access funding from the government, private sector or NGOs.

Description:

The aim of the project is to facilitate the compliance, accreditation and ultimately access to funding to improve their provision of services, quality of care and access for more children. Begun in 2018, the project has impacted 250 teachers and 2500 children through teacher training, infrastructure upgrades, equipment and school gardens. The Newlands Rotary Club is located in Cape Town South Africa.
