The bottom line is that we all have a desire to improve our community, and maybe just bring a smile to someone's face by doing something nice. Each of you is vital to our success.


Each committee has worked hard, and I'm sure they will share details of all they have accomplished, and so I just want to thank each one of YOU for what you have brought to our club.

Her ongoing commitment to us and bringing us together is so appreciated.



COMMUNITY SERVICE

Our club made a difference in the Springs. We devoted a total of 302 hours of community work this year. This is just what we were able to record. Many other hours are unrecorded, I am sure. The in-kind value to the community is estimated at over \$7000. Pretty good for a small club like ours. Thank you all who managed to find the time in your already busy schedules to come out and pitch in to these activities that benefit our community.

Our 2023–2024 projects:

- 5 individuals regularly spent time with elementary school children as reading tutors for both the Fall and Winter sessions. I am sure this project will be back.
- If we can get a few more volunteers, we might be able to continue with some senior support. Lisa and Gary Tremblay really appreciated the couple of home maintenance efforts they accomplished.
- Last August, the Community Health Center Health Fair had 5 volunteers from our club, and we raised \$2445 to pay for the backpacks and supplies. Letâ€[™]s beat both totals this year!
- We had a massive clean-up of the Springs Community along Highway 12. All three Valley Rotary clubs participated, and we gathered a truckload of trash. Expect future events just like this.
- Having qualified for a District Grant early in the Rotary year, we funded and built a wall at the Community Garden in Larson Park to create a flat area for picnics or presentations. The area was successfully used for a Masters Gardening class recently.
- We started a pollinator garden in Mary Deely's lot next to the 7-Eleven using a small environmental grant from the Rotary District.
- Other projects where we provide volunteers were for the Grange Pancake Feed, The VFW car show, FISH Bell Ringing at Safeway and the Memorial Day feed at the Veteran's Hall.



Looking forward to the new Rotary year, we will volunteer at the **Community Health Center's Back to School** Fair on Saturday, August Last year we supported the fair by raising \$2445. Let's beat that. Consider donating at this week's meeting by credit or debit card via Square (small transaction fee) or by bringing a check payable to the Sonoma Springs Rotary Foundation (tax-deductible)

and note that it is for the BTS Health Fair.

We only had 5 volunteers at last year's fair. Let's beat that! Sign up here.

Volunteers are asked to bring a box of snacks, like granola bars, and/or water/drink boxes. These will be provided for the many people coming to the event.

NO INCREASE IN CLUB DUES FOR 2024-2025

Great news! Treasurer Sandra and President-elect Jan have worked diligently with the board to create a budget for the 2024-2025 Rotary year that will allow club dues to remain at their current level of \$780.00.

Dues are comprised of 3 charges:

- District Dues: \$70.00 for the Rotary year (7/1/2024 to 6/30/2025)
- International Dues: \$59.19 for July through December billed semi annually (twice a year).
- Club Dues: \$50.22 per month which includes meals, venue charge and club operating expenses.

We will continue to offer two payment options, either a single payment of \$780 or quarterly payments of \$195.

Payment may be made by cash, check or ACH. Please let Sandra know if you want to transfer funds from your account to the Club account. She will give you the account number and routing number.

The new Rotary year begins on July 1. On that date, all members are financially responsible for the payment of International and District dues for the new Rotary year. We truly hope everyone will remain a member, but if you are not going to continue, it is important to let Sandra know before June 28.
