GUEST SPEAKER: Kathy Lawrence, CA Mentor Network program, serving adults with disability's

- This is an alternative living situation for adults with disability. Vs group home.
- Mentors providing space in their home are paid a tax free stipend of \$1500+.
- · Not a non-profit so they do not suffer annual budget cuts.
- · Started in Boston using the Foster Care system as a template. Have evolved since into their own structure
- · Local office for Lake County and Mendocino is in Lakeport.
- . No outsourcing, so they can make sure they offer quality care.
- · 4 training sessions for a mentor to be certified.
- Mentor provides a furnished bedroom; supervises medication; drives them to dr appts. The individual goes to a M-F all day program. They are picked up at the house.
- If an individual refers a mentor and they place an individual in that house they receive \$250 referral fee.
- Mentors are considered independent contractors, Suggested this is a tax free income so no impact to SS.
- No time limit on how long they stay. Mentioned the low end is usually 2-vrs.
- Currently 15 people housed in Lake County.
