

Program:

Meghann Gotcher delivered a very informative program on Humboldt County Juvenile Probation.

She explained that the purpose of the Juvenile Probation department is to give juvenile offenders a second chance. There is a strong emphasis of working with the family along with the juvenile who needs help. Young offenders in need of Mental Health treatment typically need to travel from 4 hours to 11 hours from Humboldt County. The severity of the offence will determine the actions taken to give the child a second chance. Whether it's diversionary tactics or jail-like options. There are many opportunities for employment currently the Humboldt County Juvenile Probation Department. They are about 50% staffed.
