President Ken casually presided over a very fun afternoon.

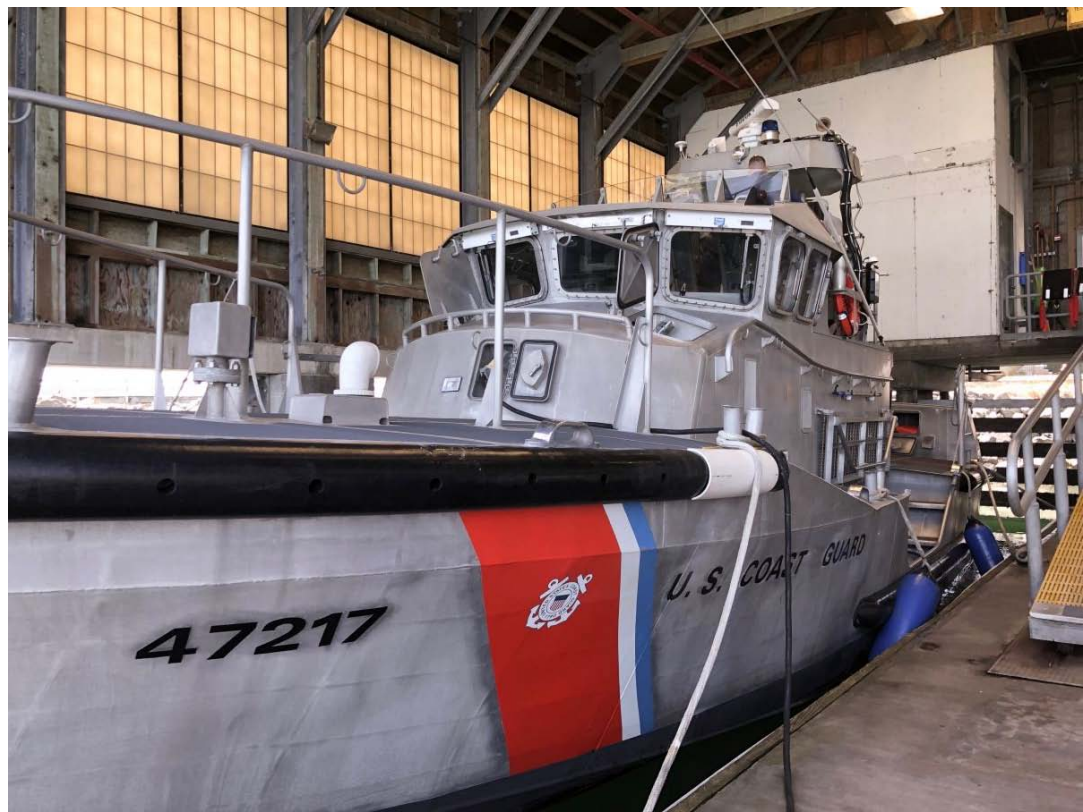


The small building on the right is a generator to keep things going if a power outage occurred.

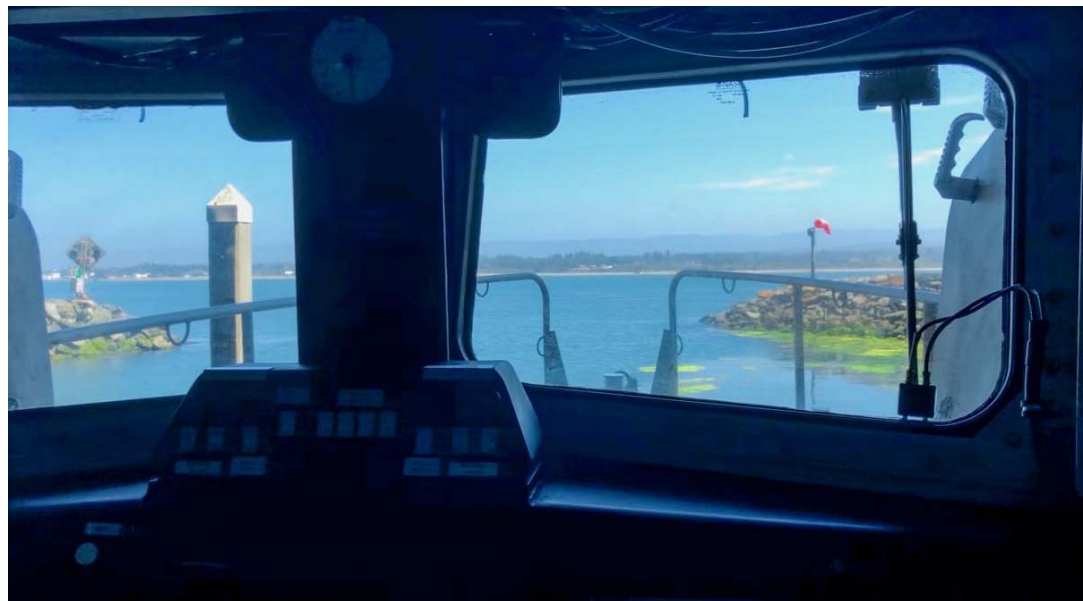


The facility still has a 1930's lifeboat on site that will be renovated. Not sure if it will be kept here locally.





This beautiful vessel is capable of turning 360 degrees in the water and handles deep-sea cases.



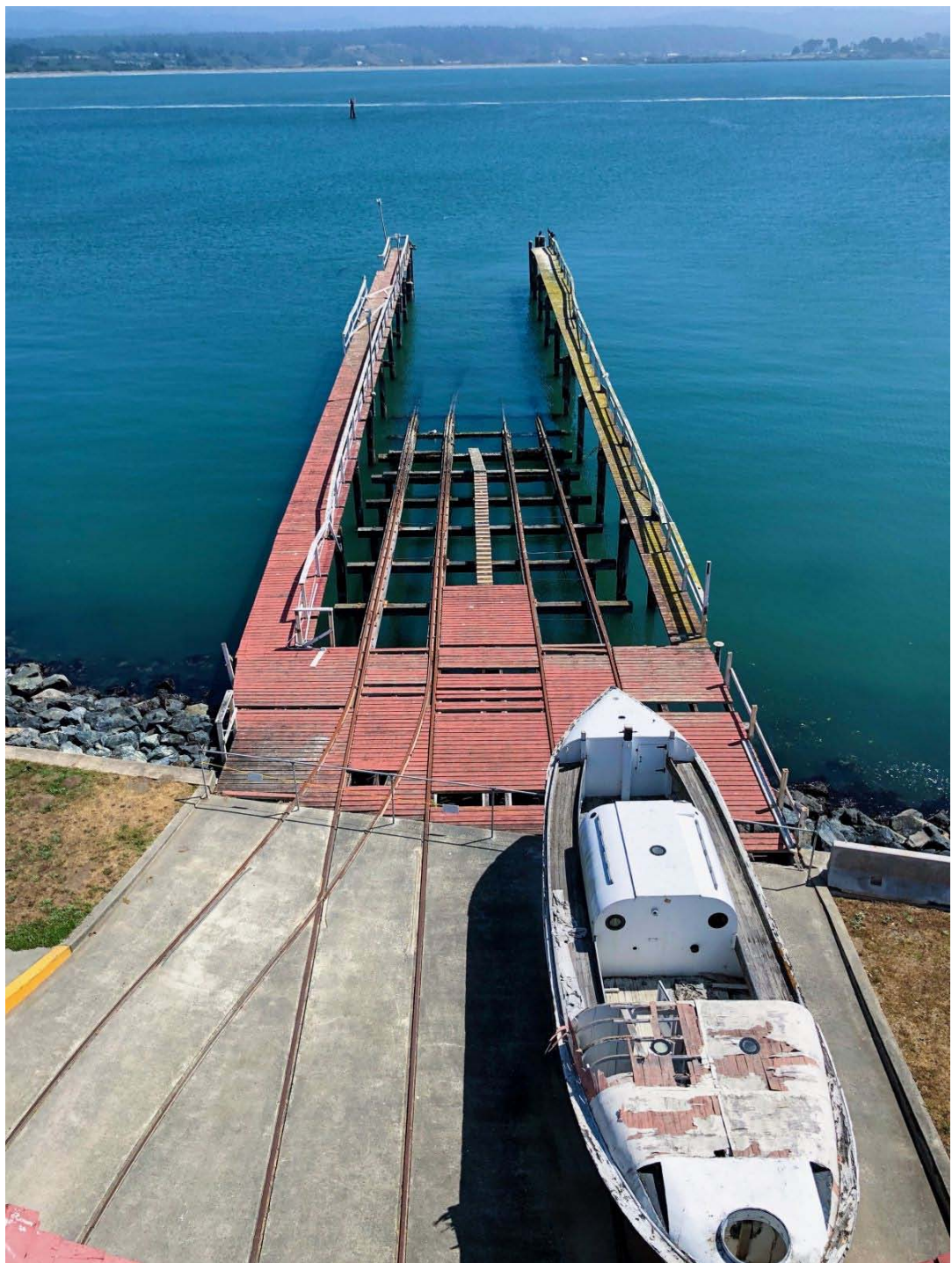
