




-Caroline from Denmark was welcomed as an honorary member and Rotary flags were exchanged.

-John Goff paid \$50 to not have to say anything- and we are all grateful.




Raffle was won by Michael Davies-Hughes. He received a Papa Murphy's free pizza coupon.

The Rotary Club of Southwest Eureka S Rotary Youth Exchange Ambassador arrived at the Bangkok Airport in late August and was welcomed by a delegation of Rotarians from her host Rotary Club of Siquore in Nakhonsswan, Thailand and members of her host family. **Angelica Mead**, a recent Arcata High School graduate, will live with host families and attend high school classes during her year in Thailand.

She will represent the Rotary Club of Southwest Eureka, Rotary International, her North Coast community and her country as one of more than 9,000 students from more than 100 countries who will live and learn the culture and language of their host countries this year. Organized in 1958, the goal of the Rotary program continues to be to promote peace around the world, one exchange at a time, according to program coordinators. Student participants are between 15 and 19 years of age and are selected for demonstrated leadership in their home schools and communities.
