GUEST SPEAKER:

Fred Merrill introduced our speaker, Nan Su. Mr. Su was born & raised in China and came to the U.S. in 1989. He has been serving as a news commentator for SOH International Chinese Radio Network and NTD International TV Network since 2003. He has made many speeches at public events in the past decade on China-related topics.

Nan Su is currently a Senior Reporter for The Epoch Times, a newspaper that is published in 35 countries and 21 languages. He's been married for 34 years and lives with his wife and 2 daughters in San Jose, CA.





Mr. Su's topic was "China's Global Expansion". Quoting about his presentation is the following:

"More than 20 years after China joined WTO, some Americans are still wondering if the Chinese government is going to have any political reforms, with many already questioning whether China will ever have one.

If the Western World is not able to make China become a part of the democratic society, then what will be the next?

As China continues its coercive behavior in its global military, economic and technological expansions, what are the lessons that Americans should learn from the past to avoid further mistakes that can jeopardize the freedoms of our future generations?"



Nan Su covered China's military drills this year around Taiwan and a lot about the South China Sea. Mr. Su spoke about the recent encounter with the U.S. destroyer in the Taiwan Strait when China sent in their ship to cut ours off, as a warning, plus the recent U.S. plane flying in China's airspace and being cut off by China's military aircraft that came within 20' of our plane. As everyone knows, China has plans to become a World Super Power, so these were just warnings to the U.S. to pay attention.



He mentioned that China, Russia & Iran's "common enemy" is the United States. Nan Su also stated that it isn't the Chinese people that hate America, it's the Regime, even though the U.S. continues to attempt to assuage China by sending billions of dollars and our industry to them, they continue to ramp up their military and make

threats our way. The lifestyles of our children and grandchildren are at stake if Russia and China continue on their path to world dominance.



Mr. Su recommended we see a documentary called "The Final War".

Mr. Su fielded many savvy questions from our members. **Art** presented Nan Su with a Certificate of Appreciation along with a Valley of the Moon pen and thanked him for coming all the way from San Jose so early in the morning to keep us informed of this important topic.

ADJOURNMENT:

President Fichtenberg adjourned our meeting at 9 a.m. and we recited the Four-Way Test.
