
the point that we are about \$10,000 away from giving this a green light to build. Pretty exciting stuff. SO CLOSE!

## PROGRAM:

EDWARD JONES INVESTMENTS AND "STAYING THE COURSEâ€ with Mark Johnson. President Sue

took it upon herself to call on Artificial Intelligence to write the bio for Mark Johnson, since she claims to know nothing about Football, Coaching, Investments, or Mark Johnson. The



Bio was very interesting. Al appears to be here to stay. Yikes! The truth is that Mark Johnsonâ€<sup>™</sup>s resume has been well documented and includes teaching and coaching stops at UC Davis, Utah State, Nevada and Boise State, as well as Woodland Christian. Five years ago, life offered Mark a change of career when he was offered the opportunity to bring his coaching expertise to the financial advising world of Edward Jones. Mark lives in Woodland with his wife Amy and their two children. He is here today to share with us some of these new skills and life lessons.





**MOVIE:** Mark starts with a <u>10-minute video. Craig Fehr</u> is the host of the movie, an Edward Jones investment guy. This video came out in July. The markets can change daily, so how relevant was this movie? It is up to you. If you had come to the meeting, you would have seen in this video how perfectly clean the guyâ€<sup>™</sup>s desk was. I will not do a synopsis on this video, for legal reasons, of course. Although the movie was very informative. Popcorn was not served!

Speaking on the similarities of coaching and while waiting for the internet to catch up, President Sue begins some Ole jokes. I am not sure if they had anything to do with our speaker, but the filler gave us a chuckle. A man was given 6 months to live and told that he should move to South Dakota. "Will I live longer?,†asked the man. "No," said his doctor, "but it will feel a lot longer."

## VISUAL AIDS - The money guru's, The Fed, meet in Jackson Hole,

Wvoming, where all the wealthy live. Why not meet in Woodland? Their info is about putting markets in perspective. Mark put handouts on the tables with some of this information in charts and graphs. Meanwhile, I noticed as Mark spoke, some of the other investment advisors in the room were not all paying attention to the program. Just the facts. **DON'T PANIC -** Mark gave an example about how he was at a juncture with his current job and was told he would be a good coach to investment clients. He could help clients find their risk tolerance and help them reach their goals that they set for a comfortable retirement. His biggest advice: plan, implement and stay the course – don't fall for shortterm hiccups, losses or gains, but rather "stay the course.â€



**QUESTIONS? John Beatty:** What is our national debt ratio? Mark has not heard a thing from the home office about this. As of August 15, 2024, the US debt-to-GDP ratio is 123%. This is due to the US debt of \$33.17 trillion being higher than the average 2023 GDP of \$26.97 trillion. Put plainly, according to Mark, this is an elephant in the room that should be removed from the room so that it doesn't stink the place up.

Mark said that his biggest fear was if he ever let his team down during his days at UC Davis football. Now he feels the same in this job: a fear if he would let his clients down. This is the hardest job he has ever had. He does not have the same control over this as he did coaching football, Mark





continues with a short analysis of his time prepping his students and athletes for the upcoming season, school year. Keep it simple and work on coaching fundamentals. As an example in his physical training classes, he would begin by giving the kids at UC a syllabus. Bottom line he told them was to think about your diet, sleeping 8 hours a day a night and you will see results. By golly, often at week 7-10, students would say that they are now able to see their bodies change for the better. Yep, all they must do is to listen to the coach. Do what he tells them to do, and you will see results. Financial planning is very similar. In summary, steady, stay the course. They all say this, donâ∈™t they? President Sue asked about crypto. Edward Jones does not deal with this. But does not deal in gold and silver as well. [Update, Mark forwarded Sue a six

page info sheet].

**Lynn Jepsen** speaks about buying on margins. Is this a problem, should you buy stocks on a margin call? This could be a problem. Mark went on to tell a story that had something to do with Omaha 400 miles away. Oh,



and something about welding, and John Deere equipment. If we can't pay cash for it, we don't need it.
