PROGRAM: Cheryl Mitchell

President Sue is back on the mic, "Come on up Cheryl Mitchell and tell us

what you do underwater." Sue gave a nice introduction of Cheryl Mitchell, our speaker. Cheryl is a scuba diver and does most of her diving in and around Monterey Bay. Scuba is the name of today's adventure. **Welcome Chery!!**

Cheryl begins with an explanation of her diving in Baja and Monterey. This is a diving part of the world where the water is warmer and a bit clearer than



Monterey Bay, where Cheryl does most of her diving. Speaking of the kelp beds in Monterey, the kelp is shrinking. Monterey water is cold and murky.





WHY? Cheryl said she learned to scuba because she wanted the adventure and told her mom at the young age of 3 that she wanted to scuba. Finally, at 14, she got the go ahead. Mom finally said, $\hat{a} \in \mathbb{C}$ Yes, you can dive. $\hat{a} \in$

WHAT? In 2019, Cheryl started taking underwater photos. Cherylâ \in TMs slide show had no captions or labels. So, please bear with me and my descriptions and accuracy.



SIGHTS FROM THE DEEP:

- One of her favorites is something I could not pronounce. She said both the common name and the official name. Still no go with me. Possibly Vent Crabs?! Some of these underwater sea creatures snack on tube worms. They get the poison out of these worms to make themselves poisonous.
- Hermit Crab. These are decapods. Got this one, it has 5 legs. This bad boy had its back completely covered in barnacles.
- Shag-Rug Nudibranch. Another translucent underwater trash type of whatever. Typically, 20-30 mm in length. Cheryl showed this while mentioning that you should not touch the floor of the ocean as this stirs up too much sand and makes the water murky, which in turn makes taking photos unclear.
- **Red Octopus:** if you take too many pictures of them, they can become more visible food for the predators.
- Rainbow Nudibranchs: Still not sure if this is the correct name. A nudibranch slug.
- Sea Lions: Yes, there are an abundance of them. Just swing by Monterey wharf. Lots of these guys are sunbathing and singing.
- Mola Mola: Flat like a dinner plate, these are the elusive ocean sunfish.



Hopkins Roses: These have both male and female reproductive organs.

Painted Greenling: These move rather quickly. Size is about 15cm

Black Perch: What do you think? A perch that is black?

• Spiny Brittle Sand Star: They hang out on the sandy floor of the ocean.

They can lose an arm for protection from predators, and they grow back rather quickly.

- **Orange cup coral:** Size of a woman's fingernail. With translucent tentacles. These don't build coral like their counterparts.
- Hermit Crab: Who doesn't know what these guys are.
- Blue Rockfish: A very common fish of Monterey Bay and is good eating.
- **Coralline Sculpin:** These fish change color to blend well with the rock walls of the ocean floor. This, of course, is a good defense against predators.




So, as you can see, there is a ton of

QUESTIONS?

Who can dive? Almost anyone, unless you are afraid of the water. You will have roughly 70–80 pounds of gear to go diving. Underwater, this is relatively zero lbs.

Is diving safe? Keep yourself safe. Itâ€[™]s up to the diver for the most part. Although Cheryl will not do a motorcycle, she says diving is safer. She refers to motorcycle riding as murder cycle and donor cycle. There are schools to learn how to scuba now, though for some schools it is more of a moneymaker than good instruction. Some are certainly better than others.



Any Fear? Yes, the landlord of the water, i.e. the Great White Shark! This underwater creature usually never bothers divers. So, she says. As Sue went to get the hook as our speaker was going long, Cheryl said, $\hat{a} \in \mathbb{C}$ Hey, $\hat{a} \in \mathbb{T}$ ve got a couple more slides, back off until I say I am done. $\hat{a} \in \mathbb{C}$ [Might have been said a bit differently, this is what I heard.] So, Cheryl continues to tell us about the equipment that is needed to Scuba dive.
