**College students – GEOFF HULBERT** Introduction by **Bob Hulbert**: "It is my pleasure to introduce today’s speaker, Geoff Hulbert, whom I can safely say I have known his entire life. Geoff was born at Woodland Memorial Hospital on November 8, 1976. He grew up in Colusa, having attended Our Lady of Lourdes School for grades K-8, and graduating from Colusa High School, where he was a three-sport athlete ---football, soccer and baseball.

Geoff then attended Willamette University [Go Bearcats!], in Salem, OR, where he played football for 4 years under Coach Dan Hawkins with the Bearcats advancing to the NAIA national championships in his junior year. It was at Willamette that Geoff met his future wife of 23 years, Jen Duran, and earned a B.S. in Economics and a Master of Arts in Teaching degree. Geoff's professional career has included teaching Economics and history at San Benito HS in Hollister; serving as teacher and Dean of Students at Regis HS in Stayton, OR; and teaching for Visions in Education Charter School prior to earning a second master's degree in special education from Western Governors' University.

Since 2018 Geoff's career focus has been on helping students with special needs succeed and thrive. This he has done as a Resource Specialist at Harriet Lee Middle School, and instructor in the Woodland JUSD young adults Life Skills Program, and currently as Director of the Department of Supportive Programs and Services at Woodland Community College. Geoff and Jen, who currently reside in Davis, are the proud parents of two daughters: Allison, a senior at Davis HS, and Paige a 9th grader at Holmes Junior HS. 

Identifying: Students with DSPS must provide documentation of a disability that impacts their learning. A student with a specialist support plan is through an intake process. **Questions? John Beatty** - What is the gender and demographic breakdown of the students who need services, about the same as the general student population? Answer yes, about the same.

**Keith Rode** – What percentage of students are looking to transfer to 4-year colleges and what percentage to the workforce? 75% are aiming to transfer. Speaker Geoff mentioned that food baskets would be passed out to

students who need them - **John Martin** said that Sunrise Rotary could help collect food for the baskets...next year. Also, Geoff added that there would be an informational open house “tonight” featuring programs and services available.
