Topic: Prioritizing Mental Health

Gordonâ \mathbb{C}^{TM} s very timely topic and his presidential initiatives were spoken â \mathbb{C} from the heart.â \mathbb{C}^{TM} He shared with us that, in his own family, his severely depressed brother, although highly successful and appeared to be on top of the world, took his own life ten years ago. This served as a wake-up that, even in the strongest of families, mental illness can occur. Talking about mental illness and emotional health may feel uncomfortable; yet, itâ \mathbb{C}^{TM} s vital to the well-being of Rotaryâ \mathbb{C}^{TM} s global community. President McInally encourages clubs and districts to work toward creating a space where itâ \mathbb{C}^{TM} s safe to address these issues to help provide a welcoming and equitable environment for all. To do that, he recommends we think about ways we can:

- 1. Erase any stigma associated with discussions of emotional well-being
- 2. Raise awareness of mental health needs
- 3. Improve access to mental health services

Following President McNallyâ€TMs remarks, additional comments on the topic of mental illness were shared by incoming District Training Director **Dave Litty, Scott Singley** and **Inge Yarborough** - - the families of each of these Rotarians have been personally impacted by cases of mental illness. Each of them are actively involved in working on Rotary and civic-based programs and initiatives to help combat the dreaded disease.

Before concluding todayâ€TMs meeting, two Rotarians - - **Carolyn Anderson** (1996) and **Memory Woodard** (1995) - - shared stories about how they came into the world of Rotary and how rewarding that has been. Ladies, thank you for nearly sixty years of *Service Above Self* and all you do for Rotary, each in your own way.

Bill Bobetsky held the winning ticket in our iconic weekly drawing and took home a Starbuckâ€TMs gift card. The evasive â€^Tblack marbleâ€TM moves forward to another day.

And with a mighty clanging of our Rotary bell, President Wanda adjourned today's meeting.


