

This brings us to our speaker, Mike McConnell!

Mike had an interesting life as CEO of two different companies in Silicon Valley where he was raised and later as a Peace Corp volunteer in â&cThe Gambiaâ&, Africa. This instilled a deep love for the small democratic country of about 2 million people. Gambia snakes along both sides of the Gambia river and started as a British protectorate. It conveniently uses English as



the official language $\hat{a} \in$ though the population comprises seven different tribes, each with their own

local tongue. Yet, they manage to get along!

During his time there, he was confronted with a problem: school children wanted to have an education but had no money for the uniforms and school costs, so over time he and his friends started to support educational efforts and finally formalized it with a volunteer-run non-profit called Gambia Rising. Our club got involved when Michael Barrington, our International Chair, got introduced to Mike McConnell and learned that one big problem was teacher turnover, as they had no housing other than living with a local farmer. So, our club provided funds to finish a building project in a small village that provided simple housing for teachers \hat{a} housing largely built with their own hands \hat{a} and we are now looking at repeating the process in another one.

This scribe got teary-eyed when Mike spoke about a girl that had grown up there and was just finishing a PHD program in math at Iowa State. Starting in a community without running water, a 2-mile walk to elementary school, 5 miles to secondary and even fewer "high schoolsâ€. What an Olympic-sized effort for those kids to carve out a future for themselves – and what a culture shock to come to this country!
