Sunday: An early morning travel trip to Sacramento to attend the last day of the District Conference, where they were introduced to conference attendees. The Turkmenistans were confused but impressed by all the volunteerism espoused by Rotary, evidently a foreign concept back home.

After the Sacramento trip, it was back to Walnut Creek for some shopping at Target.

Monday: The journalists' first "official" visit to a company in their trade was a trip to "Mother Jones" who told them how M.J. does investigative journalism and is a watchdog on the government. Not sure if this is going to translate back in Turkmenistan. The second half of the day was a trip to S.F.S.U School of Journalism. They toured the department and met with staff and students while watching a 25' screen showing live news, which happened to be happening right at the campus - the protests about the Israeli/Hamas war in Gaza. Both the size of the screen and the protests were eye-opening for them.

Tuesday: The day began with a trip to the D.V.C. School of Journalism, where they were impressed with the school newspaper's 20,000 circulation, and with the prevalence of and freedom for women.

Wednesday: A visit to the State Capitol, Sacramento, was the order of the day. They met with Steve Glazer and watched him introduce a bill on the floor. In the evening, there was a rush back to Channel 7 news where Dan Ashley met with them, and Dan even started off his evening broadcast with a live on-air mention of Dan's meeting with the group.

Thursday: The day included a trip to Los Medanos where they met with the President of the campus, then off to the Benicia Public Library for a Town Hall in celebration of *World Free Press Day.* Here they met with experienced journalists from the SF Chronicle and Oakland Tribune while discussing the meaning of a free press. Thursday evening was held at Bryan Keding's showroom, where they showed a few videos and shared information about themselves and their country. There was also a question and answer period enjoyed by the members of the Rotary Club of Concord (Hey that's us!) and a few others.

Friday: The group enjoyed a trip to the Marin Independent Journal for a tour and to see how a midsize prize-winning newspaper is run. In the afternoon, they went to the Clayton Pioneer to see a one-woman-operation newspaper. Friday evening was a goodbye dinner at Chuck and Wanda Waltman's house, where the Turkmenistans and the club members shared a wonderful meal, drinks and a good time.

Saturday: Back to reality as we say goodbye to our guests on the way back home.

• 1869, the National Woman Suffrage Association formed in New York, founded by Susan B. Anthony and Elizabeth Cady Stanton






• 1897, The Scientific-Humanitarian Committee was founded in Berlin by Magnus Hirschfeld, the first-ever LGBT rights organization.

• 1921 Italian General Election: National Bloc, including Mussolini's fascists 35 seats, win most seats but not a majority




