The remainder of the club meeting was an inspiring trip down memory lane. Club committee chairs and projects chairs took turns outlining the great work the club has done in this past year. It was

We worked at the Special Olympics. We rang the bells for the Salvation Army. We provided funds for much-needed backpacks for kids. We helped with Toys for Tots. We provided Friday Folders, Dictionaries, a judge for the Contra Costa County Science Fair, funds towards Kennedy King Scholarships..... the list goes on. Youth Services: Another long list! Memory Woodard reminded us of the amazing Robotics program at YVHS. There were stoles for graduation for the Interactors. Scholarship funds increased significantly over last year's budget. We sent kids to Camp Venture. To Camp Royal. We provided support for YV's Link Crew. It was a treat to hear from three of the Camp Royal students, reflecting on their Camp experience. Leslie Chapman reminded us of the successful Interact students' visit to Montecito, an assisted living facility. For anyone who has ever submitted a grant, you know it takes heroic effort. Thanks, **Kevin!** This past spring, we hosted a group of journalists from Turkmenistan, sponsored by Open World. Our connection to the Open World is life-changing for both the delegates and for all of us at the host club. As **Michael** pointed out, it takes a good portion of the club to execute the 1-week program, and it is yet another reason to be proud of our accomplishments.

President Wanda reminded us that we lost our friend Stan Gaunt this year, as well as **Howard Jenkins'** wife, Carol.

Membership: **Sean Duffy** reported that we inducted 6 new members this year, and he specifically thanked all who brought guests to our club. • 1950 North Korea invades South Korea, beginning the Korean War.


