

Dawn Manley is the Food & Fund drive coordinator at the Contra Costa / Solano County Food Banks. Dawn shared a most comprehensive summary of the latest developments and programs of that agency's ever-expanding programs to provide food products for ANY WHO ARE IN NEED.

Government partnerships are very important to Food Banks. The Farm Bill will help determine the amount of food subsidies we will be receiving. Here's more intel about our Food Bank:

• strong relationships with area retailers to obtain a stream of food.

• have 250 direct distribution locations each week

• serving food to 35,000 Concord residents every month

• volunteers provide about half of their workforce each month.

• Food Bank works with Cal-Fresh and other programs

• provides 40 million pounds of food to the community every year

• distributes to 16 communities to the north, as far away as Redding

• Has completed a new 8,600 sq ft Food Bank facility in Fairfield

• shipped food to disaster areas, including the Paradise fire and Maui fire





• 1973 Monica Lewinsky, American White House intern (improper relationship with Bill Clinton), born in San Francisco, California


