TODAY'S SPEAKER

Andrew Pierce of the Contra Costa Mosquito and Vector Control District gave a very informative and entertaining presentation. We learned that a cluster of about 400 mosquito eggs is roughly the size of a grain of rice and takes only 7 days to mature, so a saucer of still water can produce an impressive crop of mosquitoes. There has been one case of a deathly West Nile virus infection recently and earlier this year one species carrying the Zika virus was found in Martinez and led the agency to take aggressive measures.



Vector control monitors and tests mosquitos, but we can definitely help by reporting standing water in our neighborhoods, especially unattended pools, because they are good candidates for the release of Mosquito fish which just love to devour loads of mosquito larvae.

The West Nile Virus is actually transmitted through birds, so the community is encouraged to report dead birds (not the ones that died by flying into your window) so vector control can collect and test

them. For that, go to westnile.ca.gov or call 1-877-968-2473 (1-877-WNV-Bird).

We were glad to learn that for small collections of standing water like birdbaths, one can buy a product called "Mosquito Dunk†and home/hardware stores that will not harm pets but kills the mosquito larvae.

Besides mosquitoes, the organization will also identify ticks for you, remove ground-nests and control swarms of Yellow Jackets and bees, inspect and advise on rats, mice and skunks. You can contact them for help at 925-685-9301 or go to www.ContraCostaMosquito.com.

The last item on the agenda was the drawing and Al Kappadahl drew the white marble for a Starbucks card. The next meeting's speaker is still to be determined.




