


Mário César Martins de Camargo, member of the Rotary Club of Santo André (Brazil), has been nominated by the nominating committee for the position of president of Rotary International for 2025/2026.

Mr. De Camargo intends to boost Rotary's image by working from the top down.

"Rotary today faces stiff competition for membership and funds," he said. We need to rejuvenate the brand, especially in certain regions. We need to use post-pandemic meeting tools to allow the president to address Rotary

members around the world. We also need to develop long-term partnerships with political leaders, communities and business leaders. Let's focus on our greatest asset: 1.4 million volunteers. "

Mr. De Camargo was President of Gráfica Bandeirantes and is currently a consultant to the printing industry in Brazil. He has also been president of several professional associations in the printing and graphic arts sector, including the Brazilian Association of Graphic Technologies and ABIGRAF, the Brazilian Association of the Printing Industry.
