Program

Phil Wilke introduced our guest speakers, Sheila McQuad and Addie. The 530 Food Rescue Coalition (530FRC) is an innovative food recovery project in Butte County working to save perfectly good food from going to waste. Using a custom-built app, they mobilize volunteers to transport food donations from food retailers to non-profits. The 530FRC aims to fill gaps in the existing food recovery system.

They take food from institutions like Enloe Hospital, CSUChico, and restaurants as well. They have 183 volunteers working with over 65 nonprofit organizations across Butte County. Their nonprofit partners include housing organizations, pantries, shelters, churches, schools, community centers, health clinics, and more. They focus on getting food to people who need it most—making a particular effort to extend beyond traditional food access networks in order to reach folks where they are already working, living, learning, and playing.
