For twenty years, our club has helped bring smiles to more than **1,200** children in Antigua, Guatemala. The **Faces of Hope Project**, led by our very own **Rose Padilla Johnson** and **Jolene Bortz** (Member of Oakland Sunrise Rotary), provides life-changing surgery to Guatemalan children born with cleft lips and/or palates. Children born with a cleft experience many serious challenges, such as difficulty feeding, poor growth and overall development, dental issues, and speech issues.

The 2024 team, comprised of surgeons, anesthesiologists, pediatricians, nurses, and interpreters, kicked off our mission during the week of August 11. An entirely volunteer group, we were all committed to helping bring smiles to children and families, completing **43 surgeries** during the week. A long-standing partnership with '**Asociación Compañero Para Cirugía**' (ACPC) is critical to our success. This local boots-on-the-ground organization works to identify children needing surgery. Additionally, their dedicated staff is multi-lingual, speaking the many dialects of the region such as Q'eqchi', Poqomchi', Ixil, and Quiché, helping our team with vital interpreting services.

To hear how lives have been changed, check out this **video** and see several families' journeys as they leave their homes, receive the life-changing surgery, and then make the long trek back to their villages, joyful, facing a new life! Their journeys were both challenging and rewarding, daunting and inspiring, heartbreaking and joyful.
