


Merced Rotary - Wednesday, May 14, 2025 - Steve Newvine

Welcome today to Merced Rotary, meeting at the Elks Lodge at 12:00 noon. Come and enjoy a good lunch, catch up with friends, and meet new ones.

Our speaker today is Steve Newvine. Steve grew up in New York State and attended Syracuse University. He received a degree in communications and began his career as a television journalist in 1979 at station WICZ in Binghamton, NY. He continued in television broadcasting in Huntsville, Alabama, and later made his way to California. After working as a chamber of commerce executive for thirteen years, he finished his working career with a public utility, managing government energy efficiency programs for thirteen years.

For the last fifteen years, Steve has followed his passion for stories. He has written over 10 books, with his most recent book, Jack & Johnny published in 2024. It is about the two comedians, both having lived in California throughout most of their broadcasting careers, and their mentoring friendship over two decades. Previous books about California include Beaten Paths and Back Roads, California Back Roads, and Can Do Californians. Other books include non-fiction, detailing memories of growing up in New York state, and his work in TV broadcasting, and three works of fiction.
