Our speaker was Dr. Steven Jacobs, retired pediatrician from Modesto. Update on Polio Plus. We've had 13 cases of wild polio in the world so far this year, and vaccine created polio, down from last year's number of 90. Afghanistan and Pakistan are the remaining two countries with wild polio cases. Pakistan has had immunizers threatened and killed, and has started sending armed guards. Afghanistan has made progress in bringing the vaccine to housing units by setting up tents, avoiding the stigma of women out in public. The Gates Foundation is continuing to match 2 for 1 on Polio Plus giving.
