


## Last Week at Merced Rotary - June 18

Rotarian Steve Tietjen, Merced County Superintendent of Schools, gave a report on the Virginia Smith Trust (VST). Virginia Smith was the granddaughter of Cyril Smith, a prominent landowner in Merced County. She granted her inherited land to the students of Merced County. The land was put up as part of the plan to induce the new UC to come to Merced. In the trade of turning over the land to the UC, the county schools received 600 acres to develop. The goal is to have \$100 million in the bank for VST to use to grant scholarships to Merced County students. The county is willing to be the land bank and develop the land in phases. The first 80 acres will involve the completion of the sewer/water connections and the Campus Parkway, and will include mixed-use buildings, single-family and multifamily houses. VST is now in the selection phase of choosing a master developer.
