Capn. Clark Bone, USN, Ret. The Long Relationship Between Monterey and the Navy's Information Warfare Community

Clark Bone has over 25 years of experience leading diverse organizations and teams as a former Naval Intelligence Officer. He was recently serving as the Information Warfare Chair/Senior Intelligence Officer at the Naval Postgraduate School. He was the principal advisor to senior university leadership on information warfare-related technical curricula and research areas, integrating Navy requirements and capabilities into university strategies and developing new education and research initiatives. Clark is currently the Analysis Team Leader for Buaya Pacific Management, supporting the Institute for Security Governance.

Clark started his Navy career as a Surface Warfare Officer, assigned to the guided-missile cruisers USS JOSEPHUS DANIELS (CG 27) and USS THOMAS S. GATES (CG 51), making several deployments to the Middle East, Mediterranean, and the Caribbean. After transferring into naval intelligence, he was assigned increasingly senior leadership positions at various Navy and intelligence organizations in Hawaii, Italy, and Washington DC. From 2013-2014, Clark was the Senior Navy Fellow at the Washington DC think-tank, the Atlantic Council.

Clark's final at-sea tour was as the Ship's Intelligence Officer onboard the aircraft carrier USS NIMITZ (CVN 68) where he deployed to the Middle East and Western Pacific. Before NPS, he was the Intelligence Plans and Strategy Chief at US European Command in Stuttgart, Germany, leading the integration of intelligence into US plans and operations to counter efforts in Europe by a revanchist Russia.

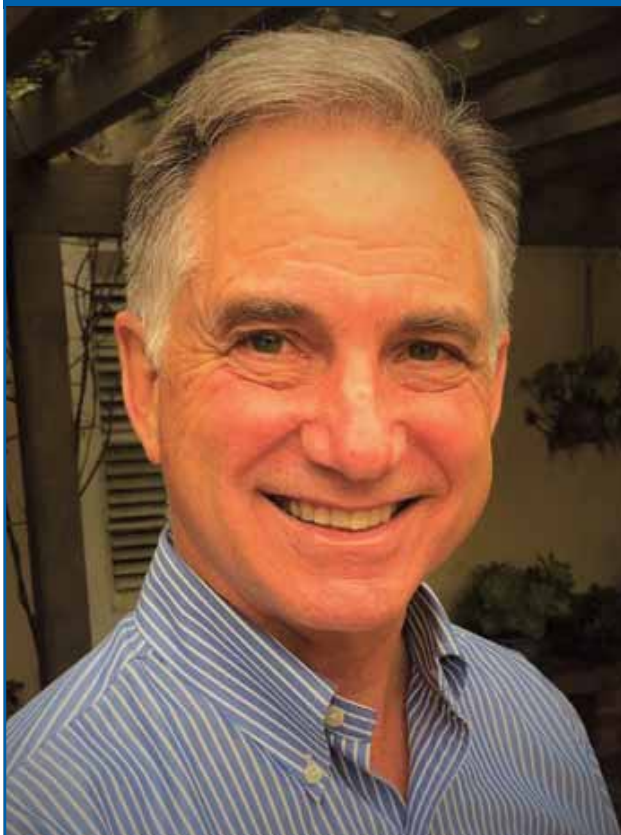
Clark has a BA in Political Science from North Carolina State University, a MA in National Security and Strategic Studies from the US Naval War College, and an Executive MBA from Naval Postgraduate School. He is also a graduate of the Navy's Naval Intelligence Executive Business Course and the Navy Senior Leader Symposium, dedicated to educating senior leaders on current and effective leadership and management techniques and philosophies.
