Outstanding Teacher

Our Club began recognizing and presenting the outstanding teacher awards in 1989. We have done so every year with the exception of 2021 during COVID. Over the last 34 years, we have honored 60 public school teachers and 21 private school teachers from 15 different schools in and around Monterey educating students from K to 12. These educators consistently go above and beyond. Student success is of paramount importance to them. They transform the lives of their students. Our three awardees this year receiving \$3,000 each are Jacqueline Lautzenhiser from Las Mesa School, Megan Ryan from Trinity Christian High School, and Amy Spencer from Stevenson Middle/Lower School.

Jacqueline Lautzenhiser Las Mesa School

Jackie Lautzenhiser has been an educator for 28 years, worked in 3 different school districts in 2 states, and spent the majority of her career teaching third and fourth grades.
