Outstanding Teacher Our Club began recognizing and presenting the outstanding teacher awards in 1989. We have done so every year with the exception of 2021 during COVID. Over the last 35 years, we have honored 63 public school teachers and 21 private school teachers from 15 different schools in and around Monterey educating students from K to 12. These educators consistently go above and beyond. Student success is of paramount importance to them. They transform the lives of their students. Our three awardees this year receiving \$3,000 each are Michelle Pierce from Monte Vista Elementary School, Natalie Croft from Monterey Bay Charter School, and Tim Bartholomew from Bay View Academy School.

Michelle Pierce Monte Vista Elementary

In that vulnerable place, we foster a deep respect and responsibility to one another through the learning process. I want my students to feel safe and celebrated in their classroom and in their learning. Each year, I get the amazing opportunity to be part of the 180 days of school to witness this magical growth. I am deeply honored and grateful for the opportunity to be in service to my students and their families.

Natalie Croft Monterey Bay Charter School

Natalie Croft graduated from Santa Catalina School in Monterey, earned a BFA in Fine Art from the San Francisco Art Institute, and holds a California Multiple Subjects teaching credential. Additional education includes studying Shakespeare at Oxford, attending classes at the San Francisco Art Academy and Hangzhou Art Academy, Waldorf grades training, seminars on Writers Workshop, and early childhood development classes.

She chooses to teach at a public Waldorf school because Waldorf Education focuses on the whole child; mind, body, and soul. Waldorf education builds endurance. Students have the capacity to take in the lessons and utilize what they have learned in an encouraging environment that promotes creativity, academic focus, and above all, bravery. A child's life journey needs a foundation rooted in kindness, compassion, and deep understanding of the world around them, so that they

respect not only themselves, but their environment and all those around them.
