laughed learning that Pete Penner is the longest-serving member in Reedley Rotary at 52 years (wow, that's a lot of lunches), and Rodney Horton is the newest member – because his boss made him join. But we also learned that the current Rotary International President is the first female President of Rotary in its 117 year history, and that the seemingly simple logo this year was painstakingly designed with each brush stroke and color representing something specific. The purple represents polio, white represents peace, and green represents the environment. The circle is the table around which all members meet, with the seven smaller circles representing the seven focus areas of Rotary, and the green line representing a digging stick, a reference to the work that we must all be putting in to make change in our world. Silly me, I just thought it was a cute little logo. This begs the question. . .if one does not know what representations are made in a logo, does it still have the same impact? If a tree falls in a forest . . .? If a bear craps in the woods. . .? Wait, bears crap in the woods?? (Yes, I know some of you won't appreciate the "c" word being used in our bulletins. So don't let your kids read it.)

Mo' Fun Moser also provided fascinating statistics on District membership. There are 2,253 members in our current District. There has been a 90% retention rate of members over the past few years. 30% of members are women. I just heard some of you men groan. Knock it off. Members in the under 40 age group are at 7.55%. And there are 54 Interact and Rotoract Clubs in the District.

Moser invited all members to participate in the Kings River Clean Up happening on October 15<sup>th</sup> in partnership with the Kings River Conservancy and City of Reedley. All members are also encouraged to mark their calendars for the Distr5ict Celebration at the Zoo on April 22, 2023. The rousing lunch fun wrapped up with several awards for service, given out by the gracious Governor, including an award to the hardworking guys who make sure that the room is set up and taken down for us each week, and one for the bulletin editor who is really just trying to give this job away to someone else who can write a factually accurate story since she isn't able to.
