has three children, ages 17, 14, and 10. He said the decision to run for Sheriff has been a family decision, one that his family does support wholeheartedly.

Zanoni has served in various capacities in the Sheriff's Department, including Detective, Boating Unit (can we just all admit that the Boating Unit is probably more "fun" than "job"?), Human Resources, Internal Affairs, Risk Management, and Assistant Sheriff for Field Services. Based on the well-rounded view of public safety, Zanoni has some operational changes he intends to make when he becomes Sheriff. Chief among those changes is to redistrict patrol beats based upon population shifts that have occurred since the 80's when beats were last established. He'll also add body-worn cameras for Deputies using grant funds, and will partner with ATF and Fresno PD to crack down on ghost guns in Fresno County. Importantly, what he does not intend to change is the stance on Concealed Weapons permits, which he believes is important for personal safety in our rural county, and he will continue the attack on fentanyl use and distribution.

Reedley Rotary was proud to host Sheriff-Elect Zanoni, and will be excited to have him back to share more public safety news in the future.
