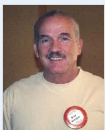

## The Big Fresno Fair

Ray McCann has been doing a lot of work getting ready for another agricultural display at the Big Fresno Fair! He went to the lectern during Friday's meeting (9/30) and let us know how the display comes together. He has to store the grapes (with a lot of assistance from Interact and other volunteers). They pick enough grapes to fill the display and swap them out once for a second round of judging.

Laying out the grapes on the display is a science in itself! You can have a "plate" display, "standard" display, "rack" display, or "feature" display. Each display has specific rules. For example the Rack Display has to contain at least 5 commercial standard display packages. With Ray's guidance, Sanger has been very successful at the Big Fresno Fair! down menu. Then click on the gallery with the blue ribbons!
