


April 8, 2021


Presentations




Program

Dr. Bill Wittich, author of *Energize Your Rotary Club* and *Stop Recruiting / Start Attracting: A Book About Change and Membership in Rotary Clubs*

Dr. Bill Wittich is a speaker, consultant, and coach in the field of leadership, motivation, and non-profit management. Bill earned his doctorate from the University of Southern California, and taught for 31 years at California State University, Long Beach. He served as the department chair for both the Departments of Film & Electronic Arts and Occupational Studies.

For the past ten years Bill and his wife Ann, have traveled an average of 250 days a year. Their speaking schedule has taken them to all corners of the United States and through much of Europe. They speak to non-profit organizations, government agencies, and professional associations. In 1990, they launched Knowledge Transfer Publishing, a training and publishing organization producing training resources for the non-profit arena. Their first book, *The Care & Feeding of Volunteers*, is now in its second printing and continues to sell around the world. Their audio cassette album, *Ten Keys for Unlocking the Secrets to Excellent Volunteer Programs*, has been a best seller in the non-profit field. Wittich is a professional member of the National Speakers Association. His client list includes a large



number of school districts, hospitals, libraries, police and fire departments, labor organizations, associations, and most of the national nonprofit organizations.

Bill is a member of the Laguna Sunrise Rotary Club.

He gave us a friendly update on membership.

First Bill said: ♦Don♦t look for new members, but attract them ♦ drawing them towards membership.

Two questions are:

- 1) Why do you want new members? New ideas, Help for your projects, and fellowship.
- 2) Why do they want to join us?

A survey was made about Reasons to join Rotary and the following results are here in order of importance.

1. Network
2. Social reasons
3. Learn something new
4. Fun!!!
5. Service.

So, what benefits the new member?

1. To learn what your Club is going to do for them
2. What benefits do we have to offer
3. People go shopping ♦ are you welcoming when they come to your Club?
4. Every one has expectations, the trick is to EXCEED their expectations.

What kind of person do you want to attract? Young people, family oriented people, women in Rotary (over 40% of this nation♦s CEOs are women), Boomers, who are now retiring in droves, people with different ethnic backgrounds (ethnic diversity) and retired people.

Bill then told us how he goes about meeting people ♦ in Starbucks (his favorite place) just sitting and talking, talking with your friends, it♦s O.K. to invite them to Rotary, join the Chamber of Commerce, in Church, on a board of a non-profit. Go out of your way and pick up prospective member and drive her to a meeting.

Don't talk about Rotary - talk about what we do.

President Terry thanked Bill for is presentation and gifted him with a flag in our next Field of Honor.
