2019 SuperBuild ♦ It ♦s not too late!

Location: SuperBuild in Tecate, Mexico. Meet in Chula Vista

Event Date: Friday, May 17, 2019 to Saturday, May 18, 2019

Event Start Time: 5:30 AM

We will be starting our journey at 5:30 am just outside of Chula Vista and traveling by bus to the area outside of Tecate Mexico. Each home that will be built will have a bus to transport all participants to the exact location of the build. The home(s) being built take 40-45 volunteers with the cut off at 45 per home. The cost for each bus requires us to charge \$30.00 per person round trip. It is imperative that all participants take the buses due to the inability to handle numerous cars at build sites. If volunteers are staying in Mexico and cannot take the bus, then the charge of \$30.00 per person will still be collected from all participants.

Rotary clubs harness international connections to tackle U.S. opioid crisis

Clubs in Mexico, India, and Canada help members in New York launch community project.

New York Rotary members used support from international partners to help them fight a major U.S. problem: opioid addiction.

After attending a wrenching funeral for a young man who died from an

opioid overdose, Lana K. Rouff, a member of the [Rotary Club of Binghamton](#), New York, USA, knew she had to do something.



After months of doing research and consulting with health officials, substance abuse experts, educators, and media professionals, they had a plan: a [Rotary Foundation](#) global grant project, totaling more than \$107,000. The project's initiatives would support those

directly affected by the epidemic, educate communities about preventing and treating opioid addiction, and prevent drug abuse among local young people by training them in leadership skills and healthy decision making.

Rouff again turned to Rotary's 1.2 million members in 35,000 clubs around the world. She found the support they needed. A Rotary club in Mexico was the first to volunteer, and then a Rotary club in Canada. Also, the Rotary clubs of Coimbatore Central and Madras Coramandel of India donated significant funds to keep the project going.

◆ It gives me hope that projects like this can happen across the country. Rotary has the resources and know-how to tackle this problem. Nothing is too big for us. ◆ Rouff acknowledges that the opioid addiction epidemic has no simple solutions. ◆ But if the project can save one life, it's worth it. ◆
