Barbara E Buckley, Esq. is an attorney and Democratic Party politician who served as a member of the Nevada Assembly, representing Clark County District 8 from 1994 to 2011. She is the first woman in Nevada history to serve as Speaker of the Nevada Assembly. She also served as Majority Leader of the Assembly from 2001 to 2007. She currently serves as Executive Director of Legal Aid Center of Southern Nevada (LACSN).

Barbara Buckley started her presentation with a story about how the Right to Counsel rule for children in foster care started. LACSN attorneys work to do the best thing for the children that they serve through their children's attorney project. She went on to discuss their family justice project, their consumer rights project, and their newest guardianship program for seniors and adults with disabilities. Last year with that program they had 400 cases. This year it has moved to 1300 cases. They have become the watchdog. They also have a pro bono project, asking every lawyer in town to volunteer with them. Currently, they have 1000 lawyers volunteering.

She also discussed the 1 October Vegas Strong Resiliency Center, which was started after the tragedy. They got a federal grant to help the survivors. LACSN volunteered right after the event to help with probate, guardianship, hospital bills, accident claims from damage to vehicles, etc. A one-stop shop has been created. The plan for the Resiliency Center is to create the first victims rights center when the federal funding runs out in 2021. It will be created for any crime.

Legal Aid Center tries to help the most vulnerable. They have also created two self-help centers in two courthouses in the Valley. They help anyone with a civil legal problem, and last year they served 100,000 people.

How can you get involved? Spread the word about the center. Volunteer. There is a volunteer opportunity for anyone that thinks they would be good arguing with the Clark County School District about getting accommodations for foster children. Also, Barbara Buckley highly recommends doing your estate planning before tragedy strikes. For more information, you can visit www.lacsn.org.

Meet 2020 2021 RI President Holger Knaack "Holger Knaack, a member of the Rotary Club of Herzogtum Lauenburg-Mölln, Germany, has been selected to serve as president of Rotary International in 2020-21.

The Nominating Committee's decision follows the resignation last month of President-nominee Sushil Gupta due to health reasons. Knaack will officially become president-nominee if no other candidates challenge him by 31 May.

To build a stronger membership, Knaack says Rotary must focus on increasing the number of female members and transitioning Rotaractors into Rotarians.

Knaack believes that the People of Action campaign offers new public awareness possibilities for Rotary. This campaign conveys our global image

while still respecting differences in regions and cultures, he says..."
