MESSAGE FROM DAWN



Dear Friends,

I am so pleased to write to you this week - there is so much to be happy about! This past Saturday, we celebrated our 75th Anniversary as a club, with a full house of folks! The 75th Gala Celebration was held at the Altadena Town and Country Club. There were quite a few members in attendance, plus a lot of community members who came to wish us well and help us celebrate! Our club, Mike and Carol Zoeller, the Mariscals

and the Altadena Library were all recognized for their commitment to making a difference and the work that we do in Altadena for the community! Commendations were received by Senator Anthony Portantino, Supervisor Barger, and Assemblymember Chris Holden.

Our District Governor, Michael Soden and his wife drove all the way from Henderson, NV to celebrate with us; I cannot thank them both enough for taking the time to come all that way just to be with us. Michael's heartfelt comments were both authentic and moving. We have an amazing DG! Incoming District Governor, Gilda Moshir, was also in attendance; you may know her from the San Marino Club.

We recognized our original sponsor in 1949, the Rotary Club of Pasadena, with President Justene Adamec ringing our bell to officially start the program (the first time a member from Pasadena has rung our











bell since we were first chartered). A group from the Pasadena Rotary Club joined us to celebrate as well.

There were presentations and speeches and I asked our current and former members to stand and be recognized, as well as all past presidents of our club. I also spoke briefly about our support for various organizations in our community, but especially support for education and women business owners.



I asked all women entrepreneurs in the

room to please stand and be recognized, and about 1/3 of the attendees did so. That was great to see! I shared with the attendees that in honor of Women's History Month each March, our club provides two grants to local business owners who are women, in the amount of \$1,000 each. Women who are either starting their business or have been in business for three years or less can apply. Once the application is submitted, a subcommittee reviews the entries and finalists are invited to give a short presentation at our meetings in March. We select from the finalists up to two recipients each year and present them with a check at a meeting in April.

We accept applications for this grant until February 29, 2024 so please share this with any woman you know who is planning to start their own business or has just started their own business and encourage them to apply!

The final part of the formal program included the announcement of a new vocational scholarship at PCC in Library Science, initiated by Mike and Carol Zoeller. Mark introduced the scholarship and Mike Zoeller committed an initial donation of \$5,000. With that, Mark opened the floor to others to donate to the scholarship fund, with over \$11,000 raised during the live auction!



Proceeds from the gala event will also be used to support this scholarship since we are deeply committed to supporting our public libraries and public libraries in general! A contingent from the Altadena Library came to our event, and Director Nikki Winslow (left), spoke about the library and was recognized for the Library's commitment to Altadena.











One of the best parts of the evening was the amount of guests who came up to me to share what a wonderful time they had and how great our club is!!! Brought both a smile and a tear to my eye!



Our DJ for the evening was Juan Carlos Lara (JC) who also handles the audio for our summer concerts. He closed out the evening with music selected from the decades to bring guests out of their chairs and onto the dance floor! One thing I learned, our members can dance!!!
