TV PRODUCTION DESIGNER AND MEMBER, ART DIRECTORS GUILD AND THE ACADEMY OF TELEVISION ARTS AND SCIENCES

If you wanted to understand a little about the challenges in the local television and movie industry since the strike was settled late last year, your opportunity to know firsthand just passed you by. Our speaker, **Jack Forrestel** shared how his opportunity to work directly in the television industry came about.

Jack started off by sharing his few years in the military (serving on the

USS Midway that is now a museum in San Diego) allowed him to use the GI Bill for going to college. While serving, he was constantly drawing. After hundreds of sketches and drawings, he was only able to retain 4 of them. For those not knowing what was happening back in 1970-1972, there was a military conflict called "Vietnam". It was difficult to keep personal items. His love for art led him to get his degree (BFA) from The Philadelphia College of Art and a MFA from Temple University. His father told him, "Find A Job Using A Pencil, not your back".

After his prestigious summer Internship he received a phone call in 1984 from Ed Swift, the Manager of Production Services at NBC. This was very unusual. He asked Jack how soon he could come across country for a job in Hollywood. Jack said, give me a few weeks and I will arrive just after the 4th of July (1984). He packed up everything, rented and drove a moving truck while towing his prized vehicle more than 3,000 miles.

He started at the show "The Price is Right". He was thrilled to be given money and told to go purchase items for the sets. He talked about working with the legendary Sy Tomashoff, who was the Production Designer on The Bold and Beautiful TV Series starting in 1987. After Sy retired, Jack was promoted to Production Designer and holds that position today. He shared with me after the meeting that after 2 years on this particular TV Series, he was asked to become the Production Designer for an upcoming movie. He contemplated that for a few weeks and decided he could see staying with The Bold and The Beautiful for another few more years. Well, it actually has been 35 years since that former opportunity came up.

Jack talked about how television sets would be set up and taken down each night (five days a week of shooting Soap Operas). This took much labor. Now, the sets (as many as 12) are designed and produced to last up to two weeks before being removed. He is planning to retire in the Fall of 2024. Since the brutal strike of 2023, more than 75% of the members of the Art Director's Guild are still not working. And with "Al" on the horizon, many Art Directors and Production Designers wonder what their profession will be like in a few short years. He credits learning the Autocad system for creating drawings, set units and making scales rather than the way taught in his University years for some of his success. But in reality, it was his tenacity towards the job of being that person in the middle between the Executive Producers, Producers and the other workers on the sets represented by the unions.

Jack did not have enough time to brag about his 6 Emmy Awards over his 40 years in the business. More impressive is the fact that according to IMDB.com, he has been nominated 21 times for his work as an Art Director and Production Designer.

Jack's wife Tina attended lunch with us. She is an Interior Designer. They met (television industry of course) in the 1990's and married in 1999. They have 3 children including Jack's daughter from a previous marriage. They have lived in Eagle Rock for the last 11 years. But prior, they lived directly across from Ed and Mona Jasnow for almost 15 years. They are good friends. And of course, Jack and Tina know which type of Chardonnay to bring to the house during visits!
