# LAST WEEK: NANCY DAVIDSON

The Altadena Rotary club received a very informative and inspiring message from Nancy Davidson, the Executive Director of the Foundation for Living Beauty. The Rotarians in attendance were impressed to know that Past President Doug has known Nancy for over 20 years! This wonderful organization was founded by Amie Satchu in 2002 when she was supporting her Mother and 2 close friends through cancer treatment. She held a "Beauty Day" and this non-profit organization was born! What began as a way to ease the pain of a few has blossomed into an organization that has served more than 1400 women across 48 states. Their mission is simple: to provide wellness support to women who are victims of cancer.

The Foundation is based in Pasadena, although the five employees work remotely, for the most part. As a non-profit, they hold three major events each year to support their operations:

Nancy offered the following considerations that might avert a predilection for cancer:

- 1. Don't top off your gas tank.
- 2. Don't drink water from plastic bottles.
- When outside, wearing blue and/or red clothes protect your skin best - but always apply lots of high SPF sunscreen.
- 4. Red meat is not a "NO NO" but marinate it first.
- 5. EAT RED GRAPES! She did not indicate that red wine was ok but some of us went there!
- Detoxify your home many carcinogens exist in the places we reside.
- Don't attach your mobile phone to your body –

1) A shopping event for donors, that supports Living Beauty.

2) A fashion show at which cancer survivors model lingerie, designed for women who have been impacted.

3) An annual golf event, at Oakmont Country Club in Glendale.

Nancy emphasized that the organization presents, both in person and virtually, healing events for the women that choose to participate, such as: yoga, spiritual healing and redefining our bodies. This multi-dimensional focus allows women in different stages of recovery to benefit from what the Living Beauty offers. They partner with local hospitals and also have grant programs for those who are struggling financially.

In closing, Nancy had Past President Doug offer everyone in the room a small stone exhibiting a gold stripe across it. She said: "The scars we carry make us more beautiful!"

## MESSAGE FROM DAWN

It was an interesting vacation. Robert and I were driving my daughter, Heather, to Renton, WA as she has taken a great full-time teaching position at Impact Schools Black River Campus. Their mission statement is representative of supporting diversity, equity,

and inclusion and I am proud now to be the parent of not one, but two educators! And, as many of you know, I was an educator myself and now work predominantly with the educational and non-profit sectors, helping them with grants, data analysis, and project management!

Four hours into our trip, we were robbed. The thieves smashed out our rental car window and took all of the small bags they could grab and throw out the window and into their SUV. We did everything right, parked right in front of the restaurant, hid all of the small bags with our laptops and such between the seats, and such. However, these thefts are carefully orchestrated and we were targeted based on the boxes the perpetrators could see from the back window. It was a theft of opportunity and happened literally five minutes after we were in the restaurant. Fortunately, only the window was damaged and we were able to drive the vehicle (albeit with cardboard taped to the door) all the way to Seattle where we traded it out for another car.









This is only the second time I have experienced a robbery. The first was when my wallet was stolen out of my office at Stevens Institute of Technology during the summer, right before I was headed to Ecuador with students. In that instance, there were cameras both on campus in the hallway and at the NJ Transit station in Hoboken where the thief purchased train tickets with my debit card. They eventually caught the person and they were held accountable.

There were surveillance cameras in the Andersen Pea Soup restaurant parking lot in Santa Nella, and it was jarring to watch the event happen from that footage. The sheriff's deputy mentioned this is a common occurence now. Sadly. It taught me that material things are fleeting and can be gone at any time. Better to put energy into service than into things.
