LAST WEEK: ANDERS COREY

The speaker this past week was Anders Corey, who currently serves as the President and Chief Executive Officer of the Altadena Recovery and Rebuild Corporation (ARRC). Prior to heading ARRC, Anders served as an advisor to Los Angeles County Supervisor Kathryn

Barger focusing on housing, land-use, economic development, legislation and development. During his career, Anders managed the County healthcare portfolio, care services, public health and mental health services. In this capacity, Anders oversaw major County capital projects including housing development and the expansion of the County's public healthcare covering the County hospital system and primary care system. He previously served as a commissioner on the Los Angeles County Mental Health Commission and on the Board of the Los Angeles County Affordable Housing Solutions Agency (LACAHSA).

ARRC was organized right after the Eaton Canyon fire with the support of Supervisor Kathryn Barger to be a lasting presence and driver of recovery in Altadena. The concept behind ARRC is that government can provide support to rebuild Altadena, but that government alone is not sufficient. It cannot fill many of the wants and needs that are necessary to make Altadena thrive again as a community. ARRC was organized to fill these gaps. The board of ARRC is comprised of Altadena community members and leaders in philanthropy, business and civic governance.

Anders Corey explained that ARRC has two purposes. The first is to assist in the collaboration between private enterprise and government, providing resources for the successful planning to rebuild Altadena and the surrounding community. The second purpose of ARRC is to focus on the long-term success and sustainability of this rebuilding effort. This rebuilding effort extends not only to constructing homes, but also to reestablishing

Altadena's commercial corridors and urban forest.



INTERNATIONAL NEWS: THEY'VE ARRIVED!




Immediate Past-President
