Our speaker this week is Mr. René Amy. He is a grass-roots community activist, a writer, a licensed general contractor, a building-code expert, an entrepreneur, an attorney and a Rotarian. He's also a member of the International Brotherhood of Real Beard Santas and the Fraternal Order of Eagles.

Rotary opened many doors in terms of volunteerism, and René has pursued several such avenues, including becoming an "ambassador" for ShelterBox, Rotary's "Disaster Response" partner, and more recently, as an "ambassador" for Operation Pollination, a global Rotary project lead by Chris Stein of the US National Park Service. He became a volunteer Court-Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) for a child in LA County's huge dependency-court system shortly after hearing a speaker from CASALA.org at the Altadena club's meeting.

René talks with thousands of folks yearly to explain just how easy and fun it can be to plant California native wildflowers. He's also passionate about community, having set the wheels in motion for two recently completed Altadena landmarks: The "Fourteen Decades of Altadena History" display at the Altadena Community Center that is centered on a four-foot-diameter tree "cookie" he rescued, preserved, finished, and installed; and the hard-to-miss "Greetings From Altadena" mural on the side of Altadena Grocery outlet (where the devil truly is in the details).

When not disseminating information to community members on Nextdoor.com, or getting down-'n'-dirty in his research garden or making small batches of his seedbark, René interacts with research biologists from the Xerces Society for the Conservation of Invertebrate Species (the group that oversees the annual Western Monarch Count), government officials, and members of the public in an effort to preserve our natural heritage now and into the future.

René's talk with us this week is part of the outreach that the Rotary International President - Jennifer Jones - is asking volunteers to do throughout clubs. She has specifically called out the Area of Focus - Environment (Saving Monarch Butterflies) as one she hopes clubs will focus on.

In existence since 1984, and a U.S. 501 (c) (3) non-profit charity since 1996, Project Amigo provides educational scholarships, material support, enrichment activities and preventive and remedial health care to disadvantaged children and youth in the State of Colima, Mexico.



Dora discussed the history of the organization and the services they provide. She described how Project Amigo owes both its beginnings and its longevity to the “service above self” contributions of thousands of Rotarians and Rotary clubs and was the official international service “project” of the Rotary Club of Novato, CA between 1996 and 2002. Today they are an independent public charity and ‘*asociacion civil*’ recognized in United States, Canada, and Mexico, and they continue to thank Rotarians and Rotary clubs for their deep, generous, and continued support.


PA has developed a school program for students in the Mexican State of Colima that wish to continue their education past the 6<sup>th</sup> grade, the last grade funded by Mexican school systems. High school students are served in the Project Amigo school building and college students are provided scholarships to attend universities. The project currently provides services for up to 200 students per year. The scholarships cover the cost of a high School education, \$600 per student per year and \$4,000 for college scholarships. The project has so far resulted in 910 High School and 110 College grads. The project seeks to augment its staff with volunteers like Boy’s and Girl’s Clubs members and other supporters, including an impressive list of US, Canadian and Mexican Rotary Clubs.

Project Amigo has changed the lives of both students and their families by providing the reality of an extended schooling to children and young adults striving to build a better life through education and the Rotary Club of Altadena salutes their efforts.

\* *Hair: The American Tribal Love-Rock Musical* is a rock musical with a book and lyrics by Gerome Ragni and James Rado and music by Galt MacDermot. The work reflects the creators' observations of the hippie counterculture and sexual revolution of the late 1960s, and several of its songs became anthems of the anti-Vietnam War peace movement. The work broke new ground in musical theatre by defining the genre of "rock musical", using a racially integrated cast, and inviting the audience onstage for a "Be-In" finale.
