The *Glendora Rotary Field of Heroes* is the gift that keeps on giving. Not only is it one of the most moving displays of patriotism, of small-town charm, of beauty, and positive public relations, but it is also one of the main ways our club funds the many wonderful things we do for the community.

Income from the Field of Heroes is split between the Veterans' Centers at Citrus
