### Meet Sara Salter Beemer - New Member Craft Talk



Sara Beemer, a Glendora Rotarian since March 11, 2025, shared her career and life journey with the club this past Tuesday. Exemplifying her family values, Sara was accompanied by her charming and articulate children, Jack, Sawyer and Laila, each of whom participated in the "club fines" with a kind word about their mom. Sara comes from a large extended family who enjoys spending time together.

Sara's career path began with the study of business finance in college. She was employed by the City of Claremont in their Finance Department and later by the City of Redondo Beach Police Department in their Finance & Budget office. She had a twenty-plus-year career in financial consulting, at which she excelled but was not her passion.

Sara realized that she needed to turn her hobby of exercise and nutrition into a career so that she could live a more meaningful and genuine life. She began

helping people with health and fitness and began earning certifications. She is passionate and curious about food and likes to call herself a "food explorer". Involving her family in meal prepping and trying out new foods and recipes are a family tradition.

Today Sara is a personal trainer, accountability coach, teaches food prepping and nutrition, and loves her work life. What she loves about this career is watching her clients reach their goals and building a lifestyle that inspires their family and friends. This is an understandable evolution considering the traumatic medical history that Sara experienced in her young life. A spinal tumor discovered at the age of 4 and a difficult recovery could have resulted in a very different outcome for a less optimistic and driven person. Inside, for Sara, it provided inspiration and the certain knowledge that the human body could overcome obstacles.

Sara is also the Chief Operating Officer for Transcend Health, concierge health for employers. Among other things, they provide corporate wellness days, biometric testing, first responder testing and tracking, virtual care, and more. A subsidiary of Transcend Health is Longevity Lab (longevitylabla.com) where Sara is the Chief Strategy Officer. Longevity Lab offers peptide therapy, IV infusions, hormone replacement therapy, red light therapy, infrared sauna, and body contouring and weight loss programs.






