Karen Davis-Where Creativity Meets Faith

Karen Davis is not only the pastor of First Christian Church of Glendora but also serves as a Councilmember of the Glendora City Council to which she was first elected in 2005. Her regional appointments include the Glendora Community Coordinating Council, Sanitation District of LA County, City Selection Committee, Metro Gold Line Extension Construction Authority, Independent Cities Association of Los Angeles County, and the League of California Cities.

Ms. Davis did not mention any of this impressive list of accomplishments to the Rotary Club, preferring to focus on another claim to fame: she met Sylvester Stallone at an advance screening of Rocky to which she had been invited as a high school entertainment editor. Karen's review for the movie was very positive, prompting her teacher to ask her for a re-write saying "this movie isn't going anywhere"!



After this amusing opening, Ms. Davis turned her attention to her intended topic, the First Christian Church Art Academy. The Academy began in 2000, inspired by two teachers who felt that the extracurricular programs at schools were not readily available. Classes offered are ceramics, drawing, painting, mosaic tile and cooking. The classes serve children as young as five, all the way to adults. Karen believes that art touches the soul and allows one to be expressive without words. The Academy sees art as very connected to what the church does as a community of faith.

The church has also expanded the art classes into outreach through their Empty Bowls and Empty Cups project. Artists create ceramic bowls and cups which are purchased by the public (filled with soup or coffee) and can then take the art home. The proceeds from these projects go to Shepherd's Pantry, St. Vincent de Paul, and vouchers at the Police

Warrior for Children

Most of you will remember the program we had last year from Warrior for Children. This is an amazing, heart-warming organization that is doing so much for an absolutely heart-breaking problem. Their mission is to provide gap services for children experiencing trauma. The "gap" referred to is that period of time (can be weeks or months) between the time a child is either rescued from exploitation or removed from a dangerous family situation and placed in emergency foster care and the time that all the paperwork can be completed for that child/foster family to receive the funding reimbursement for their most basic needs. Day or night, when Warrior for Children receives a call from an agency that there is an emergency need, they spring into action to deliver everything from all the necessities of an infant, or clothing, toiletries, comforting blankets, pillows, toys etc. Most of the time these children are removed with absolutely nothing to their name.

Kathy Boyer, whose sister-in-law works with Warrior for Children, arranged a tour of the facilities for Susanne Hayek and Tricia Franklin. Moved by the work being done by this organization, and with the belief that Christmas is for children, we hope Rotarians will bring a new toy or a gift card for one of the organization's preferred stores (Amazon, Walmart and Target) to our Christmas party. 
Rotary Friendship Exchange. Jan '25




Rotaplast Mission to Uganda June 2025
