Operation Stay Safe Is a Bridge to Permanent Housing



Tiny Homes Are Central to Operation Stay Safe

Thursday's program was on Operation Stay Safe.

The city built 30 tiny homes. Each includes a bed, a desk, shelves and other basic living amenities. From one to three people live in the manufactured homes that are set up in the parking lot at 2000 Flotilla Street in Montebello.

Participants are primarily selected through local street outreach and are assigned a unit for the duration of their stay. This approach avoids the daily lines associated with traditional emergency shelters. The site is operated by supportive services providers who are in charge of case management including: connecting clients to healthcare, job training, and a permanent housing solution. The target length of stay is 90 days.

The site provides a shared restroom, shower, and laundry facilities, as well as a communal meal space offering participants, increased access to hygiene and a sense of community.

No illegal items, illicit substances, or visitors are allowed on-site. Participants have the option to move in with their pets.
